Charles CRICK (1827-

Charles Beart Crick was born on 21 October 1827 at Hepworth, Suffolk. Hepworth is a village and civil parish in the West Suffolk district of the English county of Suffolk, 3.06 miles or 4.92 km from Bardwell where a number of 'Trade Wind' immigrants originated from. Charles' parents were William Crick (1792-162), born Sapiston, Suffolk, a cattle dealer; and Mary Simonds nee Beart (1793-1859), born Rickenhall, Suffolk.

Charles was aged 29, single, literate and a groom and labourer from Suffolk when arriving in Tasmania. He was sponsored by Joseph Cahill of Hobart Town and discharged from the Quarantine Station, Impression Bay in April 1858. Joseph Cahill had at least 640 acres in the Cumberland district in central Tasmania.

It is not known what happened to Charles Crick as no other public records could be found for him in Australia nor New Zealand.
