

The Quarry family came from Hockham, in Norfolk, England. Some of their records show their last names as being Cutting. The family comprising of Thomas and Ann and their children Arthur, Fanny, William, Susan, Emma and Ellen were sponsored by J S Waddell of Launceston, most likely Joseph Stammers Waddell.

The 1851 England Census for Huntingdonshire, Buckworth records Thomas Cutting (28), game keeper, born Hackham, Norfolk; his wife Ann, (25), born Hockham; Arthur, son (3), born Fordham, Cambridgeshire; Agatha, daughter (2), born Hockham and Henry, son (4 months) born Buckworth, Huntingdonshire.

Thomas Cutting and Ann Clarke were married in the Parish Church, Hockham, on 31 August 1846.

Thomas and Ann had eight children, two of whom were born in Tasmania after their arrival.

It is not known why Thomas and his family changed their names frequently between Cutting and Quarry.

Thomas died on 24 April 1909 at 7 Invermay Road, Launceston, aged 86. He was a member of the Star of Tasmania and Olive Branch Tents. Thomas' wife died on 6 December 1911, also at 7 Invermay Road, aged 88.
