## **Stewart, John Leslie (1808-1871)**

Stewart was a Hobart Alderman and Mayor between 1856 and 1861 but had to relinquish this position after he was declared insolvent in July 1861.

An advertisement in the Hobart *Mercury* on 18 Feb 1856, p1 advertised for a cooper and to apply to J L Stewart, Davey Street Brewery.

John Leslie Stewart was born in London on 26 September 1808. He died on 21 August 1871 and was buried at the Melbourne General Cemetery. At the time of his death he lived at 48 Hazlewood Terrace, Howe Crescent, Emerald Hill. Death notice in *The Argus*, Tue 22 Aug 1871, p4: Stewart – On the 21<sup>st</sup> inst., at his residence, Howe Crescent, Emerald Hill, John Leslie Stewart, formerly of Hobart Town, Tasmania, in his 63<sup>rd</sup> year.
